# Dr. Helen Mussallem, VON Education Fund

Dr. Helen Kathleen Mussallem, Ed.D, CC, FRCN, DGStJ, (7 January 1915 – 9 November 2012) Companion of the Order of Canada and Canada's most decorated nurse, Dr. Helen K. Mussallem was instrumental in reshaping Canadian health care by leading the charge in moving nursing education out of the hospitals and into new levels of professionalism and advocacy. She served in the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps during World War II and went on to become the Executive Director of the Canadian Nurses Association and from 1989–91 she was the President of the Victorian Order of Nurses. Today, more than a year after her passing, Helen continues to advance nursing through the Dr. Helen Mussallem, VON Education Fund.

#### Q - Why did you decide to join VON?

care. Our healthcare providers will spend less time with important but time-consuming paperwork – freeing up time that can be spent with clients, and supporting their family and


caregivers."




#### **Read Tilda Shalof's Latest Book**

#### Meals on Wheels

On a weekly basis **60 VON** volunteers deliver between **500 & 600** hot and frozen meals to a variety of individuals, including: seniors, people with physical disabilities and cognitive impairments, individuals suffering from illnesses and recovering from surgeries, and those who need special dietary planning and assistance.

#### **Foot Care Program**

People rarely realize the value of professional foot care until their feet cannot function properly. Proper foot care and foot health maintenance are essential to people's mobility, and often people with diabetes and/or older adults end up with compromised mobility because of foot issues. For over 30 years VON's specially trained foot care nurses have been providing professional foot care services in both home and clinic settings at nominal fees. When challenges are identified fees are reduced or eliminated.

The nutritious meals, friendly visits and safety checks delivered each day often enable individuals to live independently in their own homes longer, therefore saving tax dollars in hospital visits, health care and nursing home costs. **As a donor your gifts make this happen.** 

Meals on Wheels means much more than a nutritious meal. Volunteers deliver *peace of mind, a friendly smile* and the *comfort* of knowing that they are not forgotten.

Most people are born with healthy feet. But 3 out of 4 people will develop serious foot problems as they age – putting their independence and wellbeing at risk. Healthy feet contribute to your safety and health.

#### **In-Home Blood Work Services**

VON North Bay provides In-Home Blood Work to individuals that are not able to attend a clinic or hospital. This service is also one of VON North Bay's programs that remains affordable to all because of your gifts.

## Did you know this about VON North Bay?

- VON North Bay District encompasses over 42 cities and towns
- Nurses made over 53,000 home visits.
- Nurses provided foot care for over 800 clients in their homes and at monthly clinics in North Bay.
- Nurses provided blood work in the home for over 150 clients in North Bay
- Personal Support Workers made over 35,000 home visits.
- Meals on Wheels dedicated team of over 60 volunteers have delivered more than 26,000 meals to over 250 clients in the North Bay Area
