When we began the first campaign for funds in 1929, Deerfield Academy was housed entirely in wooden buildings, with one exception - the School Building, a small brick structure that cost \$18,000 in 1878. When we complete the current campaign, which I hope will be by Christmas 1957, Deerfield will have one of the most beautiful and functional campuses in all America, with buildings which will endure for a hundred years. Our job will be done.

In this letter I am not asking for money, but I might say that in the Christmas period last year Deerfield received free-will offerings for the Parents' Fund amounting to almost \$400,000. It would certainly be a great Christmas for the Boydens if this could happen again.
