1) Lee does a fine job of immediately connecting with the reason donor has sent support.
2) For me, this reference is a little graphic. I would aim instead for a more specific reference to Messrs Goatcher and Owen, perhaps focusing on well-known character traits and/or their accomplishments.
3) This is quite nice, and would work even without the candle reference above.
4.) Well done. Lee lays out exactly how the families will be notified of the donor's gift. This is a wonderful paragraph.
5.) This is one instance where I wouldn't use a postscript. In this case, my feeling is that it would come across as over-friendly. Lee is spot on in omitting a PS.
